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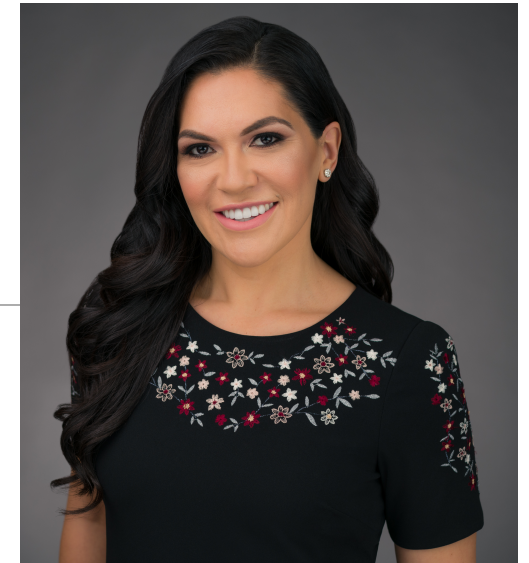




# The Chicano Federation

## Who We Are

The Chicano Federation was established in 1969 to provide a variety of comprehensive, neighborhood-based services to a large and diverse population. Our mission is to invest in underserved communities through a variety of programs aimed at building resiliency and promoting self-sufficiency.

In its early years, Chicano Federation was led by a tireless group of advocates dedicated to seeing advances in civil rights and civic participation. Today, those strong roots empower Chicano Federation to serve diverse populations throughout San Diego County with programs that help low-income children and families access vital and often life-changing services. Our history of working closely with the community makes us a trusted messenger and very effective at getting information and resources to some of the most diverse communities in San Diego County.

Chicano Federation programs and services are open to anyone who qualifies and include subsidized childcare for infants and toddlers, early childhood education at a preschool in Barrio Logan, subsidized meals for over 7,000 children a month, 300 units of affordable housing at nine apartment buildings in the Barrio Logan, City Heights, and South Park neighborhoods of San Diego, and a workforce development program that has helped hundreds of women start their own small business.

## Child Care Resources For Essential Workers



- With schools being closed, many parents and essential workers are struggling to balance the need to work and finding safe and quality care for their children.
- State and County funding has been made available to help essential workers with child care.
- YMCA has some day camps that are open and operating for families who are working. There are increased health and safety protocols in place. There is a cost associated to these day camps but it is a good option for those that may want their children to be more active while parents are working.
- The family child care providers within our network have been supporting and accepting school aged children and assisting with their online learning until schools are able to reopen.
- San Diego for Every Child has the San Diego COVID-19 Children's Fund which can help with funds for child care and other assistance.

## Finding Emergency Care

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- There are still emergency resources though our resource and referral agency which is the YMCA. They are still placing families that need emergency childcare for essential workers. CDA is also offering childcare assistance to those that qualify. It can be free or at a reduced cost to those that qualify. They have a network of providers that parents can choose from.

## Supporting Providers and Distance Learning

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Keep an open-mind, being flexible and patient with providers.

Set aside time for you and your child to spend on distance learning, reviewing material and being involved and supportive of your child while embarking on the new challenges of distance learning also keeping an open line of communication with the provider.

Knowing your child's cues is important. Let your child go at their own pace. Work with teachers on alternative activities if distance learning is not working for your child. SDCOE has a partnership with KPBS where they have combined a broadcast that is available to children grades Transitional Kindergarten-12<sup>th</sup> grade.

Once signed up, applicants will receive:

- Free In-home Wi-Fi modem/router included
- High-speed Internet up to 25 Mbps

- Must verify eligibility each year
